Principal's Report

Kaya everyone,

Welcome to Term 3 which has turned out to be a very busy one indeed. A very warm welcome to the Brewer family who have Peter in Year 1, Suzette in Kindy and beautiful Lily who will join us in about three years. Another enrolment in the background! We trust you will feel part of the school community very quickly.

I just want to have a word about attendance. It is a legal requirement that children attend an education program or school each day unless there is a valid reason why they cannot. It's only ok to miss school when:

Every day your child learns something new, so it's important they attend school every day. We know this is not always possible and they may miss a day occasionally. Always let us know the reason why as soon as possible. We can help them catch up. If you are going to be away for an extended period of time, please come and discuss it with me. We can negotiate ways you can incorporate what your child has been learning into everyday activities. This is easy to do and will maintain your child's concept knowledge. However, taking extended time away from school WILL impact on your child's learning – please keep this in mind. NAPLAN results have been distributed to parents. We use this data to plan for educational outcomes and assess how we are performing in comparison to other schools. On the whole our performance is solid. NAPLAN is not the only assessment we use. Currently the teachers are looking at a platform called 'Elastic'. All data for test results are able to be uploaded to the Elastik platform. From this we can analyse individual results and pinpoint exact curriculum items that students have not mastered. In our context this increases our capacity to deliver the content and concepts that students have either missed or have not had exposure to. It really supports our aim for each student to have either an Individual Education Plan or and Individual Curriculum Pathway.

Golf coaching has commenced with some rising young stars evident. We are able to fund this through the Sporting Schools grant. Our thanks to our coaches Chloe Gilmore and Liz Bott who encouraged the students to keep trying. We saw a number of great shots and stylish finishes.



My apologies for the quick turnaround for the Junkyard Band performance in Esperance. The information was sent in the last week of term while I was on LSL. The students who attended thoroughly enjoyed it. The sustainability message and re-use of everyday items to make musical instruments was inspiring.

Some machinery we may require, if you are able to supply are: 11/2 tonne excavator, post hole borer, shovels, rakes, and LOTS of manpower.



Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER)

The Canberra Trip for Schools

Looking to plan your schooled excursion to our nations' capital?

The Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER) program is an Australian Government initiative that provides financial assistance to support students' on-site learning about national democratic, historical and cultural institutions in Canberra. All PACER approved Institutions provide educational programs that directly align to the Australian Curriculum.

PACER-THANK YOU SO MUCH!

We started planning our trip to Canberra and applied for a PACER Rebate, we thought we were going to be very lucky to get about \$500. To be eligible schools are required to participate in PACER approved programs with at least three of the four Mandatory PACER Institutions booked when submitting an online application. The four mandatory institutions are:



- 1. Australian War Memorial (AWM)
- 2. Australian Parliament House Guided tour
- 3. Museum of Australian Democracy (MoAD)
- 4. National Electoral Education Centre (NEEC) Max 45 primary students per session or Max 40 secondary students per session (90min program).

Then we got this news!

Great news for schools planning their 2023 school excursion to our nation's capital!

The Australian Government Minister for Education, the Hon Jason Clare MP, this week approved the continuation of the 50 per cent increase in rebate amounts for 2023.

The increased rebate amounts were introduced post-Covid to encourage schools to plan excursions again to visit Canberra.

We thought we may get a little more, but we were astounded when we found out it was hundreds of dollars more. I can tell you, all the principals were texting each other saying, have you received

an email from PACER?! We were very excited, and I know how pleased all our families were too!

Munglinup Primary School, due to our location, received \$2,040 per student.

At the airport Nick, our parent help, met the Hon Patrick Gorman, MP, member for Perth. They talked about the upcoming trip and the PACER

rebate. The Honourable Patrick Gorman was really pleased that the PACER rebate had helped us so much and was happy to see us going on our trip.



Entry Information 2023

Showcase Esperance is open to Esperance residents. The winning design, as chosen by the Shire of Esperance, will be entered into the 2023 WALGA #shoWcAse IN PIXELS competition and will be displayed with other WA Local Government designs on the digital tower at Yagan Square. Anticipated display dates are 4th-24th September.

A prize of \$500 of vouchers from one or more suitable local businesses will be awarded to the local winner. Category winners will receive a \$50 voucher to a local business. Winners must be able to collect their prize in person.

Entries are judged within below categories:

- a) Non-Digitally created Lower Primary: PP-Y3
- b) Non-Digitally created Upper Primary: Y4-Y6
- c) Non-Digitally created High School Y7-Y12
- d) Non-Digitally created Community Group or Non-Digitally created Non-Professional or
- e) Digitally created (all ages) or Video (all ages) or Professional

The Banners will be judged on:

- Creative composition & artistic merit
- Individuality, boldness and humour
- Use of colour and creativity
- Is it easy to identify something about Esperance?
- · Can you read the ESPERANCE name?
- Some consideration will be given to relevance to WALGA Local Government Convention Theme: LOCAL FUTURES

Design Requirements

- · The design should promote a bright, positive image of Esperance
- The design should use large, bright and bold images as minor details will not be seen when on display. Block colours with no pencil is preferred
- The word ESPERANCE must appear in large, clear lettering. Any written messages to be short, simple, large and clear
- · As the Yagan Square digital tower faces the road, the following guidelines strictly apply:
 - No commercial advertising / brands to be displayed
 - No photograph/pictures of road networks or traffic.
 - Content cannot include colours or shapes that could be mistaken for traffic signals, signs or instruction signs.
 - Composition should not be chiefly made up of dark images which have poor daytime visibility.

Other Design Criteria:

- The design can be digitally created or physically created in any medium then digitized (photographed) or a video
- · Portrait orientation is essential.
- Digitally created artwork should use the dimensions 896 pixels (height) by 650 pixels (width). DPI of a minimum of 300 is recommended.
- For non-digital creations, a minimum size of 1472mm (h) x 1067mm (w) is recommended to ensure details are captured. A ratio of height to width 1.38 (height): 1 (width) must be maintained.
- For non-digital creations: possible 'canvases' include: paper; floor/pavement/wall; fabric/canvas/paper.
 For non-digital creations: possible media includes paint, textas, mixed media,

- collage materials, mosaic tiles, upcycled materials.
- Videos submissions must:
 - Be HD (1280px by 720px) or Full HD (1920px by 1080px) only
 - Be MP4 files only
 - Be exactly 30 seconds. Videos longer than this may be clipped, and videos shorter than this may not be approved for playback
 - Have English subtitles for all speech
 - Contain no: wind sounds; traffic sounds; or sudden/loud noises
 - Contain G-rated content only. No swearing, sexual reference or references to drugs alcohol, gambling, spoking or any illegal or antisocial behaviour
- Contain no copyrighted content, including music.

In the body of your email please include your:

- Name
- Contact phone number
- Category (see above listing)
- Confirmation that you are an Esperance resident
- Confirmation that the design submitted is original work and
- Confirmation that you have not included any copyrighted content
- Written explanation of how the work has been created and which medium has been used and the
 inspiration behind each element and/or the overall composition (Max 250 words).
