Sunday 9th June to Friday 14th June And there it goes Term 1 done and dusted! It's certainly been busy.



Enjoy the Easter break ahead and the ensuing school holidays. I look forward to returning in Week 4 after a sojourn to Kalbarri. Take care all.



an update from our youngest learners




