

Year 5 and 6 Geography Unit Humanities and Social Sciences- Cultural Diversity



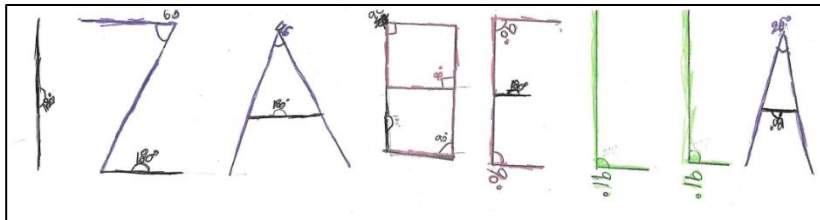
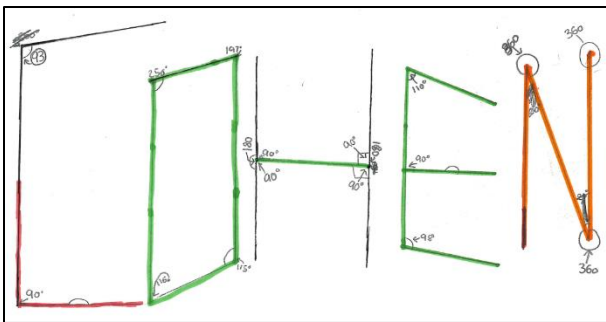
Description of Task

Using their notes students respond to three questions.

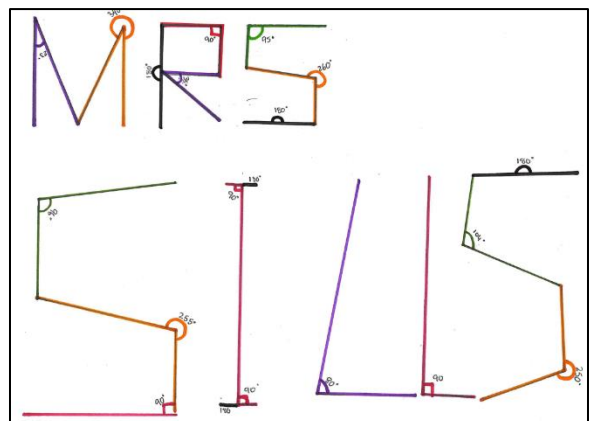
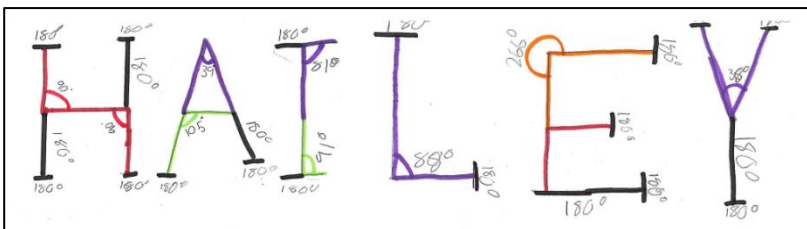
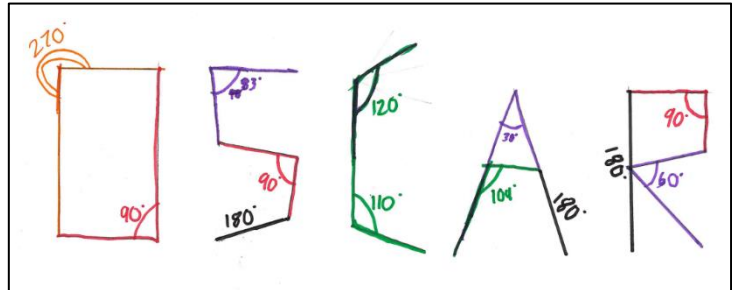
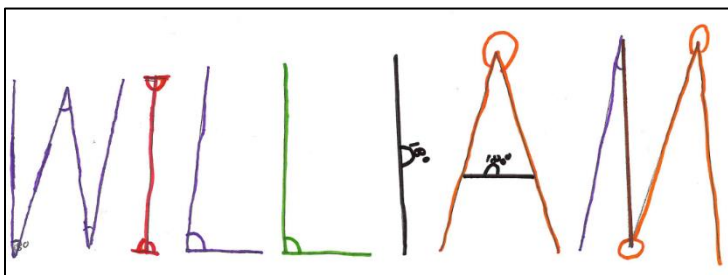
