There has been major excitement since our last newsletter – our Public School Review has been completed with the validation visit from Darren Greaves (Leadership Institute) and Sara Floyd (Principal South Stirling Primary School). My thanks to Amy Nelson who joined me via phone, Chloe Pickersgill, Alyce Ware and all the staff who participated in the validation conversations. I do not have the official report, however the informal feedback was that we are performing at a higher-than-expected level. Our next review will be in 2026, it was such an honour to present the school's achievements over the past three years.

We enjoyed welcoming the Jerdacuttup community to our Road Safety Day. Thanks to Garry Wilson – Department of Transport and Jill Fitzpatrick – Road Safety and Drug Education to a highly informative day. Parents were able to have child restraints checked and the students learnt about bike maintenance and road safety. It would be a great idea to use the Helmet Safety checklist to see if a new helmet might be a useful Christmas present. Mrs. Sills scanned and emailed the checklist to parents so you could see the results of the safety check!

Sadly, I had to miss the Wongutha CAPS excursion however the artwork the students created makes a bright display in the front office. Thank you to the staff at Wongutha for delivering engaging and interesting activities. I missed out on having my face painted  $\cong$ .

There has been lots of movement around the Nature Play space. I managed to get to Perth to collect the marine rope from Jeyco Australia who were very generous in donating 100m of white plaited marine rope for the border of the nature play area, and 40m of black rope for a low rope obstacle. James McLean and his offsider Bryce arrived on Wednesday to erect the two structures supplied jointly by the P & C and the school, and in the afternoon the woodchips arrived. All we need to do now is spread the woodchips and install the ropes – Mrs. Sills has written a full acknowledgement of everyone involved in this last part of the Nature Play build, so I won't repeat information here!!

What a lively group they are — we look forward to the last transition day before they commence for real next year.
